# Fluor signs Abu Dhabi contract

Firm to offer programme management consultancy services for public transportation network

Dubai US-based Fortune 200 firm Fluor Corporation vesterday said it has signed a contract with Abu Dhabi Department of Transport (DoT) to provide programme management consultancy (PMC) services for the emirate's overall Integrated Public Transportation Network (IPTN).

The project is part of DoT's plan to invest \$82 billion in the transport network of Abu Dhabi, which includes the construction of roads and a light rail.

Fluor was awarded the DoT contract after a competitive procurement process that included a number

"The signing took place before the end of June and we have taken proceeds on to the balance sheet for the second quarter," Fluor spokesperson Keith Stephens told Gulf News in a phone interview.

The sweeping masstransit system is being created in response to Abu Dhabi's anticipated

growth over the coming decades and in support of the vision articulated in Plan Abu Dhabi 2030. The network will be integrated with the surrounding residential and commercial developments.

Fluor will provide consulting services to the DoT on all aspects of the programme, including transportation modelling, system integration, design, procurement, construction, commercial development, funding analysis and other relevant components, Stephens said.

It will also help DoT implement an organisational development programme and build a new public transport market.
